Sometimes, parents do not have the time or money to assist their children with disabilities to ride or walk every day to school.

PARENTS AND SCHOOLS MAY WORK TOGETHER TO HELP CHILDREN GET TO SCHOOL

Schools could share a list of phone numbers of those parents who agree to coordinate with each other

- to share rides if one or more parents has a vehicle
- to accompany each others children on public transport
- to walk with each others children if the distance permits
- to volunteer to learn how to be a crossing guard
- to seek the help of local authorities to fix dangerous paths or to repair sidewalks
- to volunteer their own skills to work with schools and local authorities to repair paths and fill in missing or unsafe sections
